The last day to register for the Municipal election is Sunday, March 4. Visit elections.alaska.gov to register or update your voter registration information (moved or changed your name).

The **Ballot Review** is scheduled to be mailed to every registered household in the Municipality of Anchorage on Saturday, March 10th. The pamphlet will provide:

- an overview of Vote By Mail information
- candidates on the ballot and contact information
- information on the ballot measures; bond propositions, an initiative, Charter amendments and Municipal Code amendments.

Ballots will be mailed to every registered voter (address on file with the State Division of Elections) on Tuesday, March 13th. Additional information is available at:

How to Return Your Ballot

Anchorage Regular Municipal Election April 3, 2018

How Do I Return My Ballot?

You may choose one of three methods for returning your ballot:

- 1. Mail your ballot return envelope with first class postage to the U.S. Post Office.
 Or save postage and:
- 2. Place your ballot return envelope in a Secure Ballot Drop Box, or
- 3. Take your ballot return envelope to an Accessible Vote Center (AVC).

1. Return Your Ballot by Mail

Using first class postage, mail your ballot return envelope through the U.S. Post Office, postmarked by Election Day.

2. Return Your Ballot to a Secure Drop Box

Drop boxes will be open 24/7 about 3 weeks before Election Day.

Drop boxes will close at 8pm on Election Day, Tuesday, April 3, 2018.

Ballots must be returned to Drop Boxes no later than 8pm on Election Day.

Voters in line at the Drop Box locations by 8pm on Election Day will be allowed to drop off their ballots.

3. Return Your Ballot to an Accessible Vote Center (AVC)

Accessible Vote Centers will be open about one week before Election Day.

Accessible Vote Centers will be located at Anchorage City Hall, Loussac Library, Eagle River Town Center and at the MOA Election Center at 619 E Ship Creek Avenue, Ste 100 Door D.

Ballots must be returned to AVCs no later than 8pm on Election Day.

Voters in line at the AVCs by 8pm on Election Day will be allowed to vote or drop off their ballots.

Accessible Vote Center (AVC) Services

- Return your mail ballot.
- Replace a lost or damaged ballot.
- Receive a ballot package if you did not receive one in the mail.
- Receive voting assistance.
- Access help for other voter questions.
- Register to vote.
- Vote a questioned or provisional ballot.
