ANCHORAGE POSITIONS:

Planning and Zoning:

Statement of Positon: The LWV of Anchorage supports comprehensive planning and effective implementation of a plan aimed at quality growth and development.

Recommendation: Retain.

Community Councils:

<u>Statement of Position:</u> The LWV of Anchorage supports the concept and purpose of Community Councils as a direct and continuing means of citizen participation in government and local affairs.

Recommendation Retain.

Boards and Commissions:

Statement of Positon: The LWV of Anchorage supports broad participation by all segments of the community on Municipal boards and commissions and the periodic review of the effectiveness of all boards and commissions.

Recommendation: Retain.

Election of School Board Members:

Statement of Position: The LWV of Anchorage supports a seven member school board whose members are elected at-large to serve in designated seats.

Recommendation. Retain.

PROGRAM EMPHASIS:

- Expand and update Website to include easily accessible information.
- Make public information more accessible.
- Promote and support Youth Vote's expanding program emphasis.

LWV of ANCHORAGE GENERAL GUIDELINES:

<u>Purpose</u>: General meetings, possibly conducted in collaboration with other groups, would serve to educate the membership and general public on these identified specific areas of concern.

Format and Outcomes: A committee of League members would be responsible for soliciting relevant speakers, establishing General meeting outcomes, and upon the conclusion of the General meeting, summarizing and making recommendations to the membership on how the information gained may be used to update or validate existing positions.

Additions to Program: Our Bylaws permit additions to our adopted program should we find it necessary and spell out the procedures for doing so at a General meeting.

<u>NOTE</u>: The LWVUS added to their ByLaws a section on Diversity, Equity and Inclusion (DEI). State and Local ByLaws must conform to the LWVUS ByLaws. Therefore we are adding to our ByLaws the required section. See Article II, Section 3 (highlighted in "red").

LWV Anch ByLaws state:

Article XII – ByLaws Amendments, Section 1(c) These ByLaws may be amended by a majority vote of the Board to conform the LWV Anch ByLaws to LWVUS bylaw changes.

The board decided to include the required change as an agenda item for the Annual Meeting.

LWVUS DEI Policy is stated below.

LWV is an organization fully committed to diversity, equity, and inclusion in principle and in practice. Diversity, equity, and inclusion are central to the organization's current and future success in engaging all individuals, households, communities, and policy makers in creating a more perfect democracy.

There shall be no barriers to full participation in this organization on the basis of gender, gender identity, ethnicity, race, native or indigenous origin, age, generation, sexual orientation, culture, religion, belief system, marital status, parental status, socioeconomic status, language, accent, ability status, mental health, educational level or background, geography, nationality, work style, work experience, job role function, thinking style, personality type, physical appearance, political perspective or affiliation and/or any other characteristic that can be identified as recognizing or illustrating diversity.

LEAGUE OF WOMEN VOTERS OF ANCHORAGE BYLAWS

As amended April 2019 (2021)

As adopted: April 24, 1950.

<u>As amended at Annual Meetings</u>: March 1955, March 1958, March 1962, March 1963, March 1964, March 1966, April 1967, March 1970, April 1973, April 1974, April 1975, April 1976, April 1977, April 1978, April 1979, April 1980, April 1983, April 1987, April 1989, April 1993, March 1999, April 2002, March 2003, April 2007, April 2012, June 2016, April 2017, April 2019, (<u>April 2021</u>).

ARTICLE I - Name

Section 1. Name. The name of this organization shall be the League of Women Voters of Anchorage (LWV Anch). This local League is an integral part of the League of Women Voters of the United States (LWVUS) and of the League of Women Voters of Alaska (LWVAK).

Section 2. Form. The LWV Anch shall be a benevolent, educational, and civic non-profit organization incorporated under the laws of the State of Alaska with its principle office in Anchorage, Alaska.

Note: Local Leagues may not disband without notifying the LWVAK. Only the LWVUS can withdraw recognition.

ARTICLE II - Purposes and Policy

Section 1. Purposes.

- a. The purposes of the LWV Anch shall be to promote political responsibility through informed and active participation in government and to act on selected governmental issues.
- b. The LWV Anch is organized and operated exclusively for charitable purposes under Section 501©3 of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code. Notwithstanding any other provisions of these bylaws, the LWV Anch shall not carry out any other activities not permitted to be carried out by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under such provisions of the Internal Revenue Code. No substantial part of the LWV Anch activities shall be in attempting to influence legislation.

Section 2. Political Policy.

- a. The LWV Anch may take action on local government measures and policies in the public interest in conformity with the principles of the LWVUS.
- b. The LWV Anch shall not support oppose any political party or candidate.

Section 3. Diversion, Equity & Inclusion. The LWV Anch is fully committed to ensure compliance – in principle and in practice – with the LWVUS's Diversity, Equity and Inclusion Policy.
