LWV ANCHORAGE UPDATE September 2016 First Edition

NATURALIZATION CEREMONIES: LWV Voter Registrars witnessed 4 citizenship ceremonies in August; during those ceremonies, a total of 66 new citizens pledged allegiance to the U.S. and received their citizenship certificates. Following the ceremonies, five different Anchorage LWV members registered 70% of those new citizens to vote; the remainder promised to register later as they hurried back to work. They were reminded of the 10/9 deadline to register if they wanted to vote in the upcoming election. We have been providing voter registration services for these ceremonies for many years.

If you are not a Voter Registrar and would like to be, contact the Anchorage Division of Elections at 522-8683 for information on dates and times of training sessions. Registrars are authorized to witness the voter registration application; making it effective the day it was signed instead of the date the Division receives it. This can be extremely crucial close to or on voter registration cutoff deadlines.

UAA VOTER REGISTRATION PROJECT: We are working with Marsha Olson, a Communications instructor at UAA, who has incorporated a Voter Registration activity into her Fundamentals of Oral Communication course – a course taken by nearly all students who complete a degree at UAA. The registration project is taking place Monday, October 3, through Thursday, October 6. We will provide Voter Registrars at various times during these days in four different locations.

YOUTH VOTE AND SPIRIT OF YOUTH FREE MOVIE NIGHT: Voter Registrars were available at the free movie night at Century 16 on Tuesday, August 16, sponsored Anchorage Collaborative Coalitions, which includes Youth Vote and Spirit of Youth, a Youth Vote partner. Several new registrations were taken and one person updated their registration.

THREAD'S BOOK PARTY IN THE PARK: Voter Registrars were available at thread's 10th annual Book Party in the Park on Thursday, Augusts 11. New and updated registrations were completed at the event.

ALASKA LONG TERM CARE OMBUDSMAN: We are working with the LTC Ombudsman to provide Voter Registrars at specific nursing homes and long term care facilities on specified dates in the Anchorage and surrounding areas. We will register new residents and update voter information for current residents. At the same time we will be assisting residents complete an absentee ballot application for the November General election. After residents receive their absentee ballot, we will again go to the nursing homes and long term care facilities and provide assistance with completion of the absentee ballot. We also reviewed a voter pamphlet, Registering to Vote, Make Your

<u>Voice Matter</u>, prepared by the LTC Ombudsman's office and offered several suggestions to make the information more succinct.

We are also working with the Anchorage School District social studies teachers to promote the film event. Youth Vote will give a gift to the teacher with the most students attending the event.

RUNNING SERIES THROUGH ALASKA PUBLIC MEDIA: We will be working with Alaska Public Media to provide assistance with the Running and Debate for the State Series (candidate debates) the week of October 17 (exact dates and times TBD) and on November 3 from 8 p.m. to 10 p.m.. Channel 7 KAKM and 91.1 FM KSKA. This has been a long-standing activity performed by the League.

ALASKA LEGISLATIVE TASK FORCE ON CIVICS EDUCATION: Cari Zawodny, Board Member and Coordinator of 2016 Youth Vote, gave a presentation to the Legislative task force on August 16, 2016. Chair, Senator Gary Stevens, specifically asked for a presentation of the LWV Anchorage on-going Youth Vote program in the Anchorage School District. The presentation was well received and legislators asked multiple questions. The task force was set up based on research that shows one of the most significant ways schools can foster youth civic engagement is by providing students with opportunities to engage in reflective civic action through their classes and cocurricular and extracurricular activities.
