REMEMBERANCE: It is with great sadness that we announce the LWVUS President Dr. Deborah Ann Turner passed away on Sunday morning. This unexpected news has struck all of us at the LWVUS Board and staff with profound grief, and I know you all are feeling it too. We are grieving together as a League community for our beloved leader and friend.

Dr. Turner devoted her life's work to impacting meaningful changes in the lives of voters across the nation. As the 20th president of our 103-year old organization. Dr. Turner played a pivotal role in fighting for a more fair and representative union while uplifting racial equity in the League's mission work. Dr. Turner first joined the LWV of Metro Des Moines in 2010 and later served as president until 2015. At the same time, she also served on the LWV Iowa board as the state vice president from 2011 to 2015, becoming co-resident in 2015. In her dual roles with state and local Leagues, Deborah devoted her leadership to strengthening relationships between local leagues and the state board.

The LWV staff, Board, and Leagues from across the country mourn her loss, and our thoughts are with Dr. Turner's family during this difficult time. We are committed to honoring her legacy by continuing to uphold our value to empower voters and build stronger more inclusive democracy. As Dr. Turner always said, "We will keep on keeping on!" YOUTH VOTE is off to a great start for the new year!

On March 6th, Youth Vote will be presenting our original workshop "Building Resilience Together: Youth Adult Partnerships that Amplify Youth Voice" at Polaris K-12's Academic Distinction Assembly. We are excited to be partnering with educators, coconspirators, and youth to bring these tools to Polaris. This work is a part of a larger effort by Youth Vote members to do more in person projects in 2024, and to build relationships with youth and co-conspirators in Anchorage schools!

In January, Youth Vote learned that we received funding from the Youth Matter Grant for 2024. On January 17th we completed our orientation with Safe Alaskans and have started work on our newest project: *Next Gen Politics! Next Gen Politics* will be a podcast series designed to educate youth about local government and highlight youth doing meaningful work in the Anchorage and Mat-Su areas. Over the next few months Youth Vote will be writing scripts, interviewing youth and community representatives, recording, editing, and bringing our final product into 8th, 10th, and 12th grade classrooms in the local community. We hope this project will help Alaskan youth to know more about local government, how they can get involved, and some of the many ways that youth can make a difference in their community. We are looking forward to our site visit next Thursday on February 1st! If any League members want to get involved in our projects please reach out to Olivia Tafs and Lily Van Alstine!

With a lot of sadness, Olivia and I are both finishing up our work as co-coordinators this May to pursue graduate school out of state. BETTYE DAVIS AFRICAN AMERICAN SUMMIT – Saturday, February 10th

The LWV of Anchorage will again have a booth at the Bettye Davis African American Summit, held at Bettye Davis East Anchorage High School. The Summit is from 9 am-5 pm. The theme this year is "Marching till Equity, Equality and Justice is Won!"

The summit provides a forum for the Black community to educate policy makers and the public about the issues facing BIPOC (Black Indigenous People of Color) communities and the solutions we want to see. The Summit addresses critical issues of public policy in the areas of economics, justice, education, and health. It is the principal gathering place, idea generator, and voice for the Black community in Alaska. This year will incorporate "REP," Registration, Education and Participation" – ABC's voting platform to encourage voting in marginalized communities.
